This week’s gospel... The Parable of the Wedding Feast

In Sunday’s Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about a king who sends his servants to find guests to attend a wedding feast for his son. The king wants to share his joy and his table, just as children enjoy biking or skating more when they have others with whom to share their fun. In this parable, Jesus invites us to his table and to the greatest party ever—the great feast of the Eucharist. The parable asks what kind of guests we are. Every Sunday, we are invited to come to God’s house. Sometimes we may not feel like going, but God is always waiting eagerly for our arrival.

This week the kids will discuss how the Kingdom of Heaven is like a wedding feast. And we will ask about inviting people to different events and being invited (or not being invited) to different events.

Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Grade News

Jesus once again uses a parable to get across an important point. Sunday's parable takes place in a vineyard, an Old Testament metaphor for the people of Israel. A landowner plants a vineyard and hires tenants. When harvest time comes, the tenants kill his servants rather than give the owner his share; they kill his son when he comes to claim the owner's share. Jesus wants the elders to take their own advice and become tenants who fruitfully care for God's people.

Through our activities on Sunday the students recognized that they belong to many different communities. They practiced talking helpfully to other class mates and role playing ways to resolve conflicts. They left understanding that all people want to belong.



Seventh/Eighth Grade News

This week, we discussed the Gospel, and how God is calling us to evangelize and live his Word. This is challenging, but we can show this through our actions as well. Father Jim said that God was foolish, so we listened to "God's Own Fool" by Michael Card. God knew what he was doing when he sent his Son to Earth; God knew that Jesus would be judged and called a fool Himself. Jesus would die.

We know a lot about God and Jesus, but when asked about the Holy Spirit, we just don't seem to know as much. We reviewed Pentecost and the symbols of water, fire, and wind.

Challenge: Take 10 minutes this week. Disconnect from technology. Lock yourself in your room. Go and sit under a tree. Pray. What is God saying to you?
